


The transposition of the European Media Freedom Act (EMFA) into national legislation was the purpose of the visit of the Chairwoman of the Audiovisual Media Authority to Brussels. She took part in a roundtable discussion between candidate countries and representatives of the European Union, organized within the framework of the TAIEX instrument. During the meeting, Krasniqi stated that the AMA has full willingness and the appropriate professional capacities to transpose the EMFA into Albanian legislation, as well as to implement this Act.
